J. S. Bach admired the music of Antonio Vivaldi, and transcribed several of his concertos, although the two never met personally. Apart from music, they were from different planets. Vivaldi was a flamboyant Venetian (may be redundant) while Bach was the very model of an old-fashioned, stubborn, German head-of-household with a willingness to generate enough offspring to survive even large-scale starvation brought on by too many offspring. Such impenetrable logic sat like a brick in the tiny Bach apartment. This is how the two composers might each have written an advertisement in the “Personals” section. You decide which is which.

- 4) You do not have to give up memberships in other churches, nor do we need to notify your prior church of your decision to join ours. We are not bound by such denominational rules.


What’s your next step? Please indicate your interest in joining by completing a pew card or emailing our office at citf@mbay.net
