
We could say the same thing about “church.” The question is not “What is church?” but rather, “When is church?”

- A friend from a small group we belonged to back East suddenly dies while skiing. The small group comes to his widow’s support with visits, prayers and assistance.
- I see members lingering in the pews, long after worship, laughing together.

When is church? Church is when we experience life with love and grace, as Jesus would. We can’t do it alone—it takes others to help us gain fresh perspective and energy—“whenever two of three are gathered in My name.”
