He loved classical music. He was endlessly curious and inquisitive, and he listened with his whole mind and his whole heart. He loved the John Bull Rondo in G, as did Emily, and so they had requested it for their wedding. When I took the position as music director, the previous director gave me the music and told me it was "a winner." For many years I inserted a "special episode" to celebrate Paul's connection with the *Concours d'Elegance*. I think it pleased him. And today, here it comes again.
