Dear Members and Friends,

Nobody knows exactly how Advent started, but the custom is very ancient. In his *History of the Franks*, St. Gregory of Tours wrote that one of his predecessors, St. Perpetuus, who held the Papel See around 480, decreed a fast three times a week from the feast of St. Martin, November 11, until Christmas. In 567, the Second Council of Tours encouraged monks to fast from the beginning of December until Christmas. For a time it was nicknamed, "St. Martin's Lent." It was recorded in the Venerable Bede's history that the custom had spread to England and was practiced widely in the churches there.

I don't know about you, but I have a hard time waiting, and as theologian Paul Tillich expressed writing about the waiting of Advent, he encourages us to come to terms with waiting. He puts it like this: "Our time is a time of waiting, in fact waiting is it's own special destiny. And every time is a time of waiting... waiting for the breaking in of eternity. All time runs forward. All time both history and in personal life, is expectation. Time itself is waiting, not for another time, but for that which is eternal."
