Dear Members and Friends,

We are approaching what is known in the church as Palm or Passion Sunday, with Jesus going through a time of acknowledging that his path is going to be one of suffering. In some ways we, too, have the call, privilege and dread of the same. I have a dear friend who feels so much for those who suffer that it almost makes him physically sick.

The truth is that all people suffer to one degree or another and a second truth is that we are all called to share in suffering. Indeed, that's what Jesus was all about—taking on the suffering of the whole world.

Some time ago I recall a story circulated by Ann Landers that gave fresh meaning to this familiar biblical teaching, and I have seen it acted out on many occasions since and even recently here at Stevenson School.

Landers wrote about a fifth grade class where all the boys in the room were bald. It all began when a boy started his chemotherapy for cancer and due to the treatments had lost all his hair. Then the unexpected happened. One of the boys talked to other boys and they decided to all shave their heads. They, in fact, went as a group to the local barber and got the job done! Mr. Jones, their teacher, did the same thing, much to the distress of his wife who had never noticed before how large his ears were!

The student who led the head-shaving brigade put it this way: “The last thing he (the boy going through chemotherapy) would want is not to fit in. We wanted to make him feel better and not left out.”


Have you heard a better real-life story than that for illustrating the literal meaning of compassion, that is, “suffering with” another

person. These kids turned what had the potential of being a stigma into a badge of honor. Is this not what Christ did with the cross? And what followers of Christ have done from the earliest times emulating the suffering Savior.

Let's be open to the hurts and difficulties of those around us and bring them before the throne of grace asking God's blessing, healing and goodness to be theirs. You don't need to shave your head, just bring a friend who might need the uplift of God's Spirit.
