## It's all about service

It is so rewarding to see students at Stevenson being actively involved in serving others, whether that be in local churches in the area, Salvation Army causes, or reaching out in some other ways to the greater community. I applaud them for their involvement and look forward to when we, as a church, can work alongside of the students and they, in turn, become more involved at Church in the Forest by participating in the service of worship.

Let me share with you something said at a commencement exercise some years ago by Harvard's John F. Findlay—a scholar, humanitarian, and outstanding lecturer who it is said dominated the center years of Harvard in the 20th century. He was also a housemaster of Elliot House for 22 years; Elliot being one of the dozen or so houses where students lived their sophomore, junior and senior years.

He believed in his students strongly and stood behind them so fiercely, that they felt that they had to live up to his expectations. He said in one of his speeches to the school: “The goal of education, temporarily hidden from the young but ever emerging, is to reach the portal of service and look out to the immediate community, the nation, to the world, to one's fellow human beings, to try to repay as best one can the privilege of living.


Comprehension is redemptive; understanding is the endless call, not in mental isolation but in deepening human sympathy to others.”

A Middle Eastern proverb says it in another way, and just as powerfully: “I will set my face to the wind and scatter my handful of seed on high. Then, my little contribution to life is taken by the great wind of God and scattered where the wind wants it scattered.”

That is also a very good description and definition of the church in general and of this corner of the world. Let's be that sacred influence by our actions for goodness, fairness and inclusivity. Because of the One who said, “follow me and I will make to become...” we do nothing less.
