Dear members and friends,

The following is from the pen of just retired Presbyterian minister, John M. Buchanan, editor of *The Christian Century*. He writes:


“What does it mean to live in a world in which a resurrection happened? For one thing, we live with the proclamation that goodness and truth are not ultimately overwhelmed by evil and untruth, regardless of what is transpiring in any particular historical moment. There are days when that sounds far-fetched, unrealistic and naïve. Reality in this world is the murder of seventeen Afghan adults and children, or the killing of a seventeen-year-old black youth by a neighborhood vigilante whose act is backed by a Florida law that justifies shooting in response to any perceived threat of violence....

“When Jesus died on Good Friday, his followers lost that faith. Until Jesus’ death, they had begun to think that what he was saying and doing was good and true; contrary to conventional wisdom, peacemakers, the meek and the seekers after goodness were the blessed and truly happy ones. They had begun to believe that it is better to give than to receive, that forgiveness is always better than retaliation, that in order to live fully one has to find ways to give one’s life, and that including the outcast and marginalized is better than excluding them—all of that was shattered when the powers of the world decided that Jesus should be crucified... but then came the resurrection!

“Everything is different because we now live in a world where death did not have the final word, where truth and goodness and love are the final realities, and where resurrection happened.”

Enjoy church—on the resurrection side of life!
