
Monday morning, May 7, 2012

Yesterday, communion Sunday, the sermon was centered on the theme of “connection.” And here we are again nearing Mother’s Day, and what better theme than that to preach on such a day; however, I shot that chance by preaching that last week! No mind... here is a follow-up article that certainly lends itself to our thinking about all the encouragement and instructions from Mom, who would tell us to, “Be yourself and accept others in the same manner.” There is a powerful novel by Dostoevsky titled, *The Idiot*. There is a central character in this novel, Prince Myshkin, who does not fit in to the society around him. His peers are striving for status and power. They judge each other on the basis of money or appearance or family connections. In their world, there is no real friendship or intimacy. People use each other to meet their own needs. And into this world walks Prince Myshkin. He just doesn’t get it. He treats everyone, whether poor or rich, with respect and kindness. He has no hidden agenda, no need to dominate others. He is pure in thought, word, and deed. This makes him a fool in other’s eyes. At the same time, all these empty, cynical, status-seeking people are strangely drawn to him. He attracts others, not through money or power, but through the strength of his character.

The Idiot. If that is what an idiot is, I wish that we could all be idiots for Christ, and, as your mother would say, “Amen, go for it, kids!”
