Called to be tender and tough.


Someone said that the reaching of adulthood comes in three stages. It begins with infancy when the small child will be easily hurt and easily cry and get the attention needed to heal wounds and wipe away the tears.

The second stage begins in childhood somewhere—a youngster realizes that whining accomplishes nothing and he or she begins to be strong and may even “mis-learn” some things. Learning to not express some emotions such as grief or compassion because it would appear immature and weak. It is hoped the third stage begins as soon as possible, but with many people it doesn’t begin until mid life or later, and sometimes never at all.

In this third stage a more careful distinction develops between being sensitive and being weak. The discovery is made that if a loved one is hurt or a companion dies or parting is painful, it is human, which is to say it is mature to show emotions, to cry for example. These third stage people can be as tough when defending justice as they can be tender when taking care of a wee baby or handling a tired employee.

Abraham Lincoln was apparently a third stage man for they said of him that he was as hard as granite and soft as drifting fog. Tender and tough! That’s a model I want to aim for.
