ADVENT DEVOTIONAL BOOKLET

Christians have observed Advent for a thousand years as a time of thoughtful preparation for the celebration of Christ's birth. It is a time of preparation, anticipation and celebration. To make our observance this year special we want YOU to help capture the joy, wonder and magic of this season by writing a brief Advent reflection/musing/poem/prayer. Begin with a verse of Scripture, a phrase from Handel's Messiah, lines from a Christmas Carol, or lines from a favorite Christmas card. Write 100-150 words of prose, poetry or a prayer that will help each of us reflect on the meaning of the season and help us appreciate God's presence even in this busy (but joy filled) season. End the thought with a 20-25 word prayer or reflection question. Please submit your work by September 30 (why not do it today?).
