
Dear Members and Friends,

I should have read the *Herald* before leaving for church Sunday. Phil Bowhay's never-to-be-missed column reminded us all of December 7 being the attack on Pearl Harbor. As the old saying goes, "I remember it well!!" Being a church-going family, dad was driving us home from church and, as we hit the driveway, mom came running out of the house and told us Pearl Harbor had been bombed. We kids weren't up on particulars, but we knew something huge had just happened. Suddenly our world changed forever and a very dramatic war focus dominated our thinking.

We'd had a foretaste of sobering times to come when the Netherlands was overrun and dad had turned silent and grim worrying about the relatives. But now the feared specter of war had come into our home. A new energy came into existence as we saved metals and paper for recycling. We grew a victory garden and learned to churn milk for butter as it was rationed. The newspaper ran photos of the young men entering the military and when the sirens went off we turned off the lights—once during an evening church service—leaving us scared and anxious in the dark. Camouflage covered the aircraft factory and the adjoining roadways. New war songs arose—some pretty ribald in their depictions of the enemy. And so we grew up hanging on the news, worrying and cheering when the news was good, silent and teary when loved young men were killed.

One thing steadied us above all else—our trust in God. Even when death came, shocking and ugly, we sang "Safe in the Arms of Jesus," and found the comfort that only faith brings.

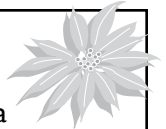
