Dear Friends,

Thinking about our Lenten sermon series, "A Skeptics Guide to God," I came upon a most unanticipated book: *An Atheist In Heaven: The Ultimate Experience For Life After Death* by Paul Davids.

The book details unexplained phenomena that challenge scientifically-minded skeptics. In particular, it examines the case of Forrest J. Ackerman (1916-2008), a famous futurist and atheist who did not believe in life after death. He promised friends, however, that were he wrong, he would try to drop them a line. For over six years data has accumulated that Mr. Ackerman continues to communicate, with over 100 incidents, studied at two universities. This has left top science professors in fields from chemistry to psychology completely baffled, and in some cases, troubled by unexplainable incidents they themselves have experienced.

You may not have time to read 513 pages before Sunday, but as one theologian said when asked to prove faith: "Jesus loves me this I know, for the Bible tells me so." This Sunday we'll look at the most beloved verse of the New Testament, John 3:16. And remember: "For those who believe, no explanation is necessary; for those who do not believe, no explanation is possible."
