How does a person find spiritual growth? That's a live question among those who have attended our five Small Group exploration conversations.

Our first impulse is to select a study topic or book, to want to learn more about religion and scripture.


Of course, I spent a big chunk of my life doing just this, with a B.A., M. Div., Th. M, and Th. D. in religion—I am afraid to count the years represented by these degrees!

But knowing “about” religion is no substitute for being known by God. Experiencing that God knows us fully brings truth, freedom, energy, joy and hope. It is the experience of grace.

Indeed, there is a significant group of people who know a great deal about religion, but feel trapped and hopeless—I am talking about some clergy. Sociologists Josh Packard and Todd Ferguson have studied the experiences of pastors and other religious professionals who, despite years of religious study, feel they are stuck in their faith and work. This Sunday we'll explore what it means to know more “about” God and what it means to be known by God. You can ponder this distinction, while reading ahead the sermon passage, the story of the Woman at the Well (John 4).
