Sunday we look at “laughter in the forest” in the account of Abraham and Sarah, learning they would be parents at age 99 and 89. We should never overlook the improbable of life!

Here’s a “humorous” true story. It’s about a Baptist preacher, Charles McCoy. McCoy was pastoring a Baptist church and, in his spare time, he had earned seven university degrees, including two Ph.D.’s—one from Dartmouth, the other from Columbia. But now, at age 72, he was mandated by his denomination to retire.

He was depressed. “I just lay on my bed thinking that my life’s over. I’ve been pastor of this church for so many years and nobody really wants me much—what have I done? I’ve spent an awful lot of time working for degrees, but what does that count for?”

A week later he met a pastor from India and, on impulse, asked him to preach in his church. After the service the Indian brother asked him to return the favor. McCoy prayed about it and decided he would. He sold most of his belongings, put what was left in a trunk, and booked a one-way passage to India—his first trip ever out of the US!

When he arrived in Bombay, he discovered to his horror that his trunk was lost. All he had were his wallet, his passport, and the address of the mission in Bombay. He asked for directions and headed for the mission. When he got there, he discovered that, while on the streetcar, his wallet and passport had been stolen.

The missionaries welcomed him, but told him the man who had invited him was still in the U.S. and would probably remain there indefinitely. What was he going to do now?

Unperturbed, McCoy told them he had come to preach, and that he would try to make an appointment with the mayor of Bombay. McCoy set out for the mayor’s office the next day. When the mayor saw McCoy’s business card, listing all his degrees, he reasoned that McCoy must be someone important. So the mayor held a tea in his honor, attended by all of the officials of Bombay!

Thus was launched a brand new, 16-year ministry. Until he died at age 88, this dauntless old man circled the globe, preaching the gospel. It was incongruous—an old man, feeling worthless at age 72, leaving everything he

had ever known and preaching around the world. That’s funny! But funnier still was the surprise of God’s grace, fulfilling this “old” man’s unfinished calling!

May we all know this surprising humor of God in our lives, whenever we wait with worries!
