A warm welcome to Alyson Harvey. This talented mezzo-soprano’s many solo appearances include work with the Atlanta Baroque Orchestra; the Berkshire Back Society; the Spoleto Festivals of Charleston, SC and Spoleto, Italy, working with Gian Carlo Menotti; the Mostly Mozart Festival, and the Philadelphia Orchestra under the baton of Bobby McFerrin. She made her Carnegie Hall debut in performances of Handel’s “Messiah” with the Masterwork Chorus of New Jersey, and her Alice Tully debut in Copland’s “In the Beginning” at the New York Philharmonic’s Copland Festival. This will be Alyson’s ninth season with the Carmel Bach Festival; her other professional affiliations include many seasons with The Philadelphia Singers, Fuma Sacra, and St. Martin’s in the Fields Episcopal Church in Philadelphia. Alyson holds degrees from the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music (MM and Artist Diploma in Opera) and Westminster Choir College (BM). Alyson maintains a private voice studio in Philadelphia, PA, where she lives with her husband Rich and two sweet kitties Mikey and Judy. We are fortunate indeed to have her with us today.

Five of the received and anticipated applications stem from your recommendations, clearly one of the best candidate sources. Additionally, we should comment to the quality of our applicants thus far. The Quakers quietly praised God for the blessings that the fire brings.


The Jews posted symbols above the door hoping that the fire would pass over.
