Dear Friends,


Yesterday we finished our week of Oregon cycling, rolling across the Cycle Oregon finish line.

We were greeted by the cheers of those who had already finished (much earlier) and ice cream bars. We ate a lot of food this week, famished by climbing hills and summer heat. And we ate in community with our fellow cyclists, trading stories about the ride and our lives. Being famished gave way to being family—conversation, joking and supportive words. Hunger was satisfied with food, but much more.

The Christian faith has developed ancient practices that take our brute, physical hungers and elevate them into spiritual practices that serve the community and connect us to the deeply nourishing spirit of Christ. Eating, resting, sex and more are elevated and imbued with Christ's energy in practices like Communion, Sabbath-keeping, holy marriage and daily prayers.

When we lose that connection to God and community, these hungers can drive us into danger zones. This Sunday's sermon text allows us to explore the blessing and danger of our hunger. It's the Bible story of Esau, who, famished, sells his birthright for a dish of stew.

He can be heard on thirteen *Chanticleer* recordings, including the Grammy Award-winning “Colors of Love.” As a Bach specialist, he has performed many of Bach’s Cantatas, Masses and Passions throughout the United States, including, of course, here in Carmel.

Most recently, Tim embarked on a new project to resurrect the overlooked song gems of Robert Franz, a 19th century German composer whose friends included Wagner, Liszt, Mendelssohn and Robert and Clara Schumann.
