I am so pleased to welcome back my friend, organist and early music specialist, Emi Saeki. She has prepared a program of relatively unknown gems that richly compliment Joanne’s theme today. She also provided some program notes:

J. P. Sweelinck was a Dutch composer, organist of the Oude Kerk in Amsterdam and one of the principal figures in the development of organ music before J. S. Bach. He gave daily public concerts on the church organ and his work helped establish the north German organ tradition, thereby influencing both Handel and Bach.

Johann Kuhnau was organist and cantor at the Church of St. Thomas in Leipzig for 21 years. (Kuhnau’s successor as Thomaskantor was J. S. Bach, who stayed at the job for 27 years!) His reputation today rests on his seven programmatic “Biblical” keyboard sonatas published in 1700, in which each sonata depicted in detail a particular story from the Bible.
