

ANNOUNCEMENTS: This **Sunday, August 21**, is the 66th annual Pebble Beach *Concours d’Elegance*. Joe Heston, of KSBW wrote in his recent editorial: “The term ‘carmeggedon’ is often bandied about. But as you sit in traffic, we hope your patience is tempered knowing that Car Week is the biggest economic event on the Monterey Peninsula. Last year alone it generated nearly \$54 million in local revenue, and more than \$4 million in local taxes. Dozens of local charities also benefit: since 1950, the *Concours d’Elegance* at Pebble Beach has donated more than \$21 million to local organizations like the United Way, Boys and Girls Clubs, and Community Hospital.”

Do know that our valets will be there to help you park your car this Sunday? Most *Concours* visitors are required to park off site, so Pebble Beach should be easily navigated.
