Dear members and friends,

One of my “go to people” hung up his preaching robe just this last Sunday. John M. Buchanan has retired after serving as Senior Minister at Fourth Presbyterian Church in Chicago for the past twenty-six years. Our church treasurer, Peter McKee, and his wife, Joan, were members of Fourth Presbyterian Church and, like me, reveled in John Buchanan’s writings and preaching.

In a recent editorial in the *Christian Century*, Buchanan wrote a piece on “Blessed Messes,” which I want to share with you here as a “thank you” to one who has helped me along the way to understand and discover God in these messy moments.

In response to his reading *The Jesus Way*, by Eugene Peterson, John Buchanan relates an occasion where he had to deal with a very messy situation:

“I learned about this the hard way. Years ago I was asked to chair a committee to help five rural Indiana congregations that were struggling to pay their bills and keep their doors open. Each was located in a small community with a declining population. Each one had once been a vital part of the community that included a bank, a drugstore and a public school. Only the churches remained.


“The committee came up with the logical solution: do what the banks and the school had done—consolidate. It was a brilliant idea—and utterly naïve. Didn’t the committee understand that members’ parents were buried in the churchyard? Our church, they said, might not be much statistically, but it’s our church and we love it and we’re not ready to give it up. The grand plan died and my committee was dismissed. Our committee had forgotten to pay attention to how much people love their churches.”

Quoting Eugene Peterson, Buchanan concludes: “Living in community as a people of God is inherently messy.”

Truth in life is messy at times but through it all there is a certain orderliness and reliability in the God who calls each of us.

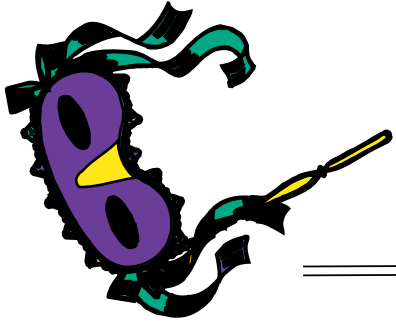

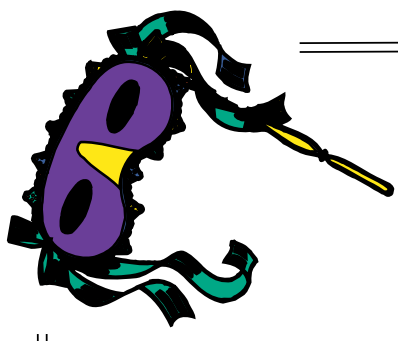
