

It's traditional. Rain is headed to the Monterey Peninsula, just in time for the AT&T Pebble Beach National Pro-Am. The PGA Tour's forecast calls for an 80 percent chance of rain for Thursday's opening round, with a quarter to a half-inch expected. The storm is expected to hit overnight, with chances of rain decreasing by the afternoon. A few lingering light showers are possible Friday, with rain chances increasing Saturday into Sunday as another storm system approaches the coast. The National Weather Service expects four-tenths to three-quarters of an inch of rainfall between Thursday and Saturday. Temperatures are expected to be below normal, with highs in the 50s through Saturday. South-southwest winds are expected to be at 10 to 18 mph on Thursday.

Dear Members and Friends,

You probably know well the old Indian proverb about not judging another person until you walk a mile in his moccasins. Well, I hope that we are especially aware of the needs of those among us who are physically or mentally disabled. Those of us who are not so challenged often take for granted those things, which are insurmountable obstacles for other people, precisely because we haven't tried to walk in their moccasins. Garry Moles of the Associated Press once put a series of questions to us like this. He asked: "Have you ever tried to ride a bicycle to your upstairs bedroom or attempted to find the elevator behind the fifth floor with your eyes closed, or attended a concert where the musicians moved but make no sound, or spent several days in a building with no rest rooms, or used a water fountain or voting machine while sitting on the floor, or played baseball with your hands in your pockets, or tried to open a heavy door in a court house or supermarket while on roller skates, buy a part for your washing machine without being able to utter a word, or get paid sixteen dollars a day to get to work? If you have, you might have an inkling of what the disabled face every single day. It might do something for your awareness to be blindfolded for the day or have one hand tied behind your back. It could be a very creative way to walk in someone else's moccasins."

Jesus called us to love our neighbor as ourselves—a call to just that kind of sensitivity!
