If your toes want tapping you've come to the right Sunday, as Dixieland Jazz is our Mardi Gras connection. "Dixieland" most often refers to the work of certain white (!!!) jazz musicians, deriving from the name of the first important group of this kind, the "Original Dixieland Jazz Band," a group of five white guys (cornet, trombone, clarinet, drums and piano) from New Orleans. It was an unusual, indelible mixture of black jazz and white middle class dance music. Anyway, they moved to Chicago in 1916 and to New York a year later, skyrocketing to fame, until the mid 1920s, when they ran out of gas, answering the cultural imperative to get out of music and into something "respectable" and profitable.

For more music, Dixieland Monterey will present its annual "Jazz Bash By The Bay" on March 6-7-8 at the Portola Plaza. This is a nationally-recognized program of Traditional and Classic Jazz. Enjoy!

Just a minute!


