Marks of Discipleship

As we come up to the time of the year when we nominate people for positions of service on the Church Board, the Fund for the Future Board and next year's Nominating Committee, I am reminded that this same pledge was, and is, given to clergy and to the lay people in service at one of the churches I served. All over the country, in cities, towns or villages, when a minister was called to serve the local church, he or she would be asked these same great questions:

"Will you serve with energy?"

If we are part of God's church in any capacity we have to unravel what that means for us today in our locality. The bottom line is that as leaders in the church we will surely need energy—Energy enough to care, to dig down, and to persist.

"Will you serve with Intelligence?"

We are called to cultivate the insights and have the intelligence to know the ministry of the church. It was Martin Luther who made the first reference to "The priesthood of all believers," on Christmas Day 1520. The right and dignity of that priesthood remains in the community—in the people—with the laity.


"Will you serve with Imagination?"

There is much to be said for sanctified imagination. Imagine yourselves, consider yourselves as companions of Jesus—having and knowing his presence in this contemporary world with all its demands, troubles and opportunities. Imagine him as your constant companion. Isaiah was one of those individuals who practiced that Divine imagination and said: "So that I may know how to reply to the wearied, the Lord provides me with speech. Each morning He awakes me to hear, to listen as God's follower."

"Will you serve with Love?"

In the final analysis, love is a verb. It is what we do that says who we are. May I say that so many of you have so readily agreed to be part of the fellowship of this church and have been and are ready to show what that love for God and humanity is all about. Love is action—love is a verb.
