Dear members and friends,

I am privileged to share some thoughts or a prayer at morning assemblies at Stevenson School on Mondays and Fridays. So today, given that graduation is but twelve days away, I presented something that I hoped would be of help to the students as they are preparing for exams and getting ready to depart for their college studies.

Perhaps that same message might be an inspiration to you as well as these teenagers in transition. It comes from the *Essene Book of Days*, presented by Danaan Parry, with wonderful thoughts for each day. Here is one of them:


"Life is a series of trapeze swings. I'm either hanging on to the trapeze bar swinging along, or for a few moments, I'm hurdling through space between the trapeze bars. It's here that I sense the most growth. For me to grow I must release my grip on the present well-known bar, in order to reach and move to the new one, and for some moments in time I must hurdle across space before I can grab the new bar. Each time I am filled with terror.

"Perhaps this is the essence of what the mystics call faith. No guarantees, no net, no insurance, but I, and we do it anyway, because holding on to the old bar is no longer an option. It is in this transition that real change occurs.

"I have a sneaking suspicion that the transition zone is the only real thing, and the bars are the illusions we dream up to not notice the void. Yes, with all the fear that can accompany transitions, they are still the most vibrant, growth-filled moments in our lives.

"Allowing ourselves to dwell in the only place where change happens can be terrifying. It can also be fantastically exciting and enlightening. Hurdling through the void, we just may learn to fly!"
