Dear Members and Friends,

Polish-born American rabbi and writer, Isaac Bashevis Singer is the greatest Yiddish storyteller of the century. He wrote a short story called, "The son from America." In it, the son has been gone from the tiny village in Poland for forty years. He has made a fortune in the United States of America and now returns to the place of his birth for a visit.

Nothing has changed in the village. When he asks his father what he has done with the money orders sent each year from America, the father shows him all the money in an old boot.

"Father, this is a treasure! Why didn't you spend it?"

"On what? Thank God we have everything."


The son asks question after question, but the answer is always the same: they lack for nothing. The garden, the cow, the goat, the chickens provide them with all they need. The son spends the next day observing the "poverty" of the townspeople. Then he begins to think of the suitcase full of gifts, of his plans to bring wealth to everyone in the village.

Then he realizes that they need nothing. They truly have everything.

How many times we are caught in such a predicament? We have "made it" possibly even making a fortune and we have spent it on ourselves building what we think is "the good life." But if truth be told, nothing is needed. Jesus told people plainly that it is only when we lose our life for the sake of the gospel that we find our lives complete.
