Dear members and friends,

One of the courses that is offered at Stevenson as a final year class elective is: *Living Successfully with Change*.

As a church, we are very aware of the physical changes that have and are taking place at Stevenson School. The entrance to the school will soon be directly opposite Lisbon Lane, making it much easier to enter and exit. They are developing a new parking area adjacent to the entrance that will be completed this summer. Ultimately, the entire front of the school and, therefore, the church entrance will be enhanced significantly, and parking will be much easier as well.

In the meantime, the school is going to supply **two** golf carts that will carry three or four people each to ferry you to the church and back to your car after the service or coffee hour. Some of us who can or are able to walk a bit more will have extra parking “off site” near the tennis courts at the corner of Forest Lake and Viscaino Roads. Look for signage that will direct those of you who may be a wee bit uncertain about driving and parking. For most of us, we can easily park on Wilson Field and be ferried to the church door.

Coffee will be served at the church throughout the summer months as well and, it is hoped, the weather will permit us to gather on the deck for fellowship. If not, we will use the church itself and the multi-purpose room.

We will keep you posted about all of this as we go along. I just wanted you to know what will be taking place over the next weeks, and to encourage you to please keep attending church. We would miss your presence and that would also detract from our family worship experience.
