They have toured extensively and recorded 3 CDs of their unique arrangements for flute and soprano.

Soprano Norma has performed throughout the United States as well as in Europe, in operas and concert appearances. Recent tours have taken her to Italy, Russia, Estonia, Germany, and France. From the *Monterey Herald*: “splendid singer... a meltingly rich voice.”

Flutist Richard is at home in many musical genres, including classical, jazz, and pop. He and Norma perform an impressive repertoire, encompassing early music, art songs, opera, African-American spirituals, and show tunes.

Perhaps you've heard about that new toy that you can buy. It is made to fit into the "Modern Age." No matter how you put it together, it's wrong!


