This week I am performing an all-Bach program. I am starting with the “Solfeggietto” by C.P.E. Bach. Carl Phillip Emmanuel was the fifth child of Johann Sebastian and is known as the “Berlin Bach” or the “Hamburg Bach.” He was an influential composer working at a time of transition between his father’s Baroque style and the Classical and Romantic styles that followed it.

“Solfeggietto “ is a short, solo keyboard piece.

J.S. Bach’s “Chromatic Fantasy and Fugue” is an extravagant work of virtuosity and bold harmonic structure. It is unique in character compared to the rest of Bach’s music. The title comes from either the Fugue’s chromatic melody, or from the startling modulations in the Fantasy. The Fugue begins in a strict style, but gradually loosens. The subject of the Fugue appears eleven times.

J.S. Bach wrote forty-eight Preludes and Fugues. They are in all twenty-four major and minor keys. The first pair in C major, the second in C minor and so on. Bach composed them “for the profit and use of musical youth desirous of learning, and especially for the pastime of those already skilled in this study.” They are usually referred to as “the 48” and are generally regarded as being amongst the most influential works in the history of Western classical music.
