*It is a joy to introduce to you Ken Feske, who will be helping us out a couple of days a week. He will minister to the members of the congregation who have been so faithful in the past and now need us to minister to them where they are, and Ken plans to explore effective ways to accomplish that. Give him and his wife Nancy a warm welcome.*

With over thirty years of providing guidance in religious, educational and community sectors, we are fortunate to have Ken Feske join us as an associate minister at Church in the Forest. From 1981-1989, Ken was the senior pastor at Monte Vista Baptist Church of Phoenix, AZ, where he developed a city-wide, multi-service resource for home-bound persons, which involved 2500 volunteers from 53 congregations giving 70,000 hours annually. He also initiated a senior midweek luncheon with an average attendance of 180 people.

From 1989-2006, Ken was the senior pastor at First Baptist Church in Salinas where, among many other important accomplishments, he started the popular Streets of Bethlehem, a living Nativity and village that attracts 20,000+ people each Christmas season.

More recently, Ken has been with University Corporation at California State University Monterey Bay, as Soledad Street Revitalization Project Director from 2007 through this past June, providing administrative support, community-based planning, as well as teaching and securing grants.

When asked for a statement, Ken responded, "I am honored and excited with the opportunity of being part of the pastoral team at Church in the Forest. Being back in parish ministry after

seven years at the university brings me back to where my heart has always been. CitF is a special community of believers who are joyfully committed to Jesus' central focus of compassion. Nancy and I are grateful to be a part of this family. If I can be of support to you, please give me that opportunity."

Ken hit the ground running and is already working on several exciting endeavors certain to enhance our spiritual experiences. Details will be forthcoming as we finalize arrangements. And by the way, with Ken comes his lovely and talented wife, Nancy Borino.
