Dear members and friends,

For the next four newsletters I will be presenting a short devotional for your use as you spend time in prayer or meditation during Advent. This is a season of the church year that affords us a wonderful opportunity to just wait on the Lord and put aside the rush and pressure of approaching Christmas.

Text for the day:

Now the Lord said to Abraham, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you." —Genesis 12:1

People move from one place to another for many reasons. Perhaps it is because of an opportunity to advance in one's career or arises from a desire to pursue academic goals. It could be a wish to live closer to family or friends or it may be a search for a more comfortable climate. (That would be difficult to find outside of the Peninsula, however.) It might even be the sheer adventure of seeking new surroundings with their promise of exciting, new life experiences.

If a person listens closely enough with ears of faith s/he just may hear the voice of God calling her/him to a new place. Certainly that was true for Abraham and Sarah. God called them to undertake a journey of faith and discovery. The Bible traces the beginning of the whole long story of salvation to this singular call over four millennia ago. We, too, are at times called to an enlarged spiritual journey that would be worth the taking.


So, that leaves you and me with three questions:

- Where is God calling us to go this Advent?
- What do we need for the journey?
- What can you count on God to supply?

A prayer for the week:

God of our journeys, lead your people forth in faith to new places of your choosing where we might serve you as your son, our Lord, gave himself for the world. Amen.
