Dear members and friends,

God visits God's people

God spoke all these words: "I, the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; you shall have no other gods before me." —Exodus 20:1-3

The journey was becoming harder by the day. The hot, dry desert air caked in their throats. They choked on the dust. At last they arrived at the river at the base of the holy mountain. The children of Israel, newly freed from slavery in Egypt, had no clue about the breathtaking events that would unfold in the next few days.

First came thunder and lightning. Next, a thick, menacing cloud settled on the top of the mountain. Finally, fire descended upon the peak and wrapped the entire mountain in smoke. God had come to visit his people. Moses, having heard God's summons, slowly began to climb the rocky slope.

Then God spoke. Not once, but ten times the voice of God thundered down the mountain slopes as God established his law for all time. But notice what God said first. He prefaced his ten commandments with these critical words. "I brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery." God's righteous law is based on God's righteous activity. God acts on behalf of his chosen ones and calls them into a covenant relationship and a life of service.


Three questions for this week:
