Journey into Exile

The Babylonians carried the rest of the people into exile

—2 Kings 25:11

Can you imagine what it would be like to live in exile—your homeland ruined, cities leveled, farms destroyed, groves mowed under, vineyards uprooted orchards wiped out your young men pressed into service by the invading army, your women raped, your holdings pillaged, and the boldest and bravest of the survivors marched off into exile 500 miles away?

Would you ever see your homeland again? Would you even want to return, knowing how the invading army had reached the land virtually uninhabitable through its “scorched earth” conquest?

That is what the people of God faced in 586 BC when the empowered Babylonian army successfully conquered Judah. It was a devastating defeat, everything was lost, and the people wondered if God cared anymore.

But God was concerned. God was present in their midst and empowered a faithful remnant to keep hope alive. Ultimately, they were freed and able to return and rebuild their cities and farms and even the temple.

At times we may feel cut off from familiar surroundings as well as close friends and family. Know this: as God was with those in exile of old, so God will never leave you.

Three questions for us to think about:

- Have you ever felt cut off?
- How did God strengthen you?
- How can you reach out to the lonely and dispossessed?
