Dear Members and Friends,

Do you ever listen to country music? It was the music *de riguer* in the cow barns where I relief-milked cows during summer vacation from college. Milking started at 1:00 AM in the morning. It was cold, the cows and cement floors were wet after washing and the radio bleated forth the nasal sounds of heartbreak and lost loves in the western style.

Since then I have been surprised occasionally to hear some very clever or affecting Country Western songs. The old joke is “What do you get when you play a C/W song backwards? You get your pickup back, your dog back and your girl back.” But once in awhile it has some interesting theology in it.

A while back I left San Francisco late and on the radio was a C/W station. Thinking it would help keep me awake I left it on. One of the songs played was one titled “Unanswered Prayers.” The male singer takes his wife to a reunion football game where he runs into his old flame. He thinks of what might have been. He remembers how passionate he was about this flame and how he prayed every night that God would make her his. As he looks at her he realizes how infinitely better his life is that God never answered that prayer. The chorus of the piece has him singing “I thank God for unanswered prayers.”

The song has it right in many ways. The statement being that we seldom know what is truly good for us. We set our minds on things of this earth and God has plans for us that we can't even imagine. The things we want so desperately could in the end truncate our growth or keep us locked in a mindset that needs to be shattered so greater dreams can be ours. If we live long enough and surrender our wills to God, we, too, might be able to sing someday in a nasal tone, “Thank God for unanswered prayers.”
